AGREEMENT FOR STUDENT EXCHANGE BETWEEN

Rajasthan College of Engineering for Women, Jaipur

AND

Rajasthan Institute of Engineering & Technology, Chittorgarh

Rajasthan college of Engineering for Women, Jaipur, and Rajasthan Institute of Engineering & Technology Chittorgarh, agrees to implement a Student Exchange Agreement in accordance with the principles and guidelines set forth below. The purpose of this agreement is to enhance the educational experiences and the cultural understanding of students from both institutions.

Student Exchange Criteria

It is agreed that:

- The purpose of each student exchange is to enable students to take classes but not to study for a degree at the host institution. Courses passed at the host institution will normally be accepted for credit towards the degree at the candidate's home institution in which s'he is enrolled. It will be the responsibility of each participant in the student exchange program to obtain official approval from his/her own institution for courses taken at the host institution.
- This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and all prior discussions, agreements, and understandings, whether verbal or in writing, is merged in this agreement.
- By addendum and with the written approval between both the institutes, the exchange can be extended to include other colleges and departments, as long as the principle of a balanced exchange is maintained.
- Participants will be subject to the standard rules, regulations, and enrollment constraints of the institutes in the selection of courses.

5. The departments/divisions involved in the exchange at the home university will provide academic counseling to ensure that the academic courses taken at the host institution are acceptable to the home institution. The host institution will provide course descriptions and syllabi to aid in course equivalency evaluation.

Policies Agreed by both Institutes:-

- 1. No monetary consideration will be exchanged between the two institutions, nor there any indemnities, reimbursements for expenses, or sharing of fees or profits arising from the exchange.
- 2. The parties agreed to do not discriminate on the basis of age, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, height, marital status, political persuasion, race, religion, sexual orientation, veteran status, or weight.
- 3. Both institutions, faculty, and students participating in the Program will comply with Applicable rules and regulations of both the institutes as prescribed.

Review, Contacts, Signatories

This Agreement is subject to review at the end of the first year and shall be effective for five years from the date of final signature. It shall be subject to revision, modification or renewal by amutual written agreement. Either party may terminate the Agreement by written notice submitted at least 30 days in advance of the next academic semester. Termination would not affect students already engaged in the Agreement. If the Agreement is not renewed by mutual consent, the Agreement will conclude at the end of the specified time period, or after activities in progress have concluded.

AGREEMENT FOR FACULTY EXCHANGE Between RAJASTHAN COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING FOR WOMEN, JAIPUR and RAJASTHAN PHARMACY COLLEGE

PURPOSE I.

In recognition of the proven value of more academic experiences for Faculty and Technical Staff, Rajasthan College of Engineering for Women, Jaipur and Rajasthan Pharmacy College, establish this agreement to mutually facilitate exchanges of faculty between the institutes.

OBJECTIVE II.

The objective of this agreement is to encourage educational cooperation and exchange between our institutions in the following areas:

- Exchange of faculty and staff;
- B. Collaborative research projects;
- C. Exchange of information, library acquisition and publications;
- D. Special short-term programs for professional and academic groups;
- E. Promotion of lectures, research workshops, symposia, and other activities jointly developed by the universities.

SCOPE III.

This agreement may extend to any recognized academic field at either institution, Principal 26/13/2021

EXCHANGE OF FACULTY & STAFF IV.

- A. Both institutions agree to encourage faculty and staff participation in exchange program activities.
- B. The period of exchange will be determined by the purpose of the exchange. The duration of the faculty and staff exchanges shall be arranged as appropriate and in accordance with the established rules and practices of the institute's management.
- C. Both the institutes are agreeing to supply office space, library privileges, technology linkage, and other facilities appropriate to the position.
- D. This agreement pertains to exchange participants only, and does not include spouses or dependents.

OTHER ACTIVITIES V.

Both institutions agree to develop initiatives that are of mutual benefit to Faculty, These initiatives will be developed academic, and non-academic staff. collaboratively and will be authorized by the appropriate administrators on each campus. Details of new initiatives will be negotiated by both parties, as the need arises.

DURATION, CONDITIONS AND MODIFICATIONS OF THIS VI. AGREEMENT

- A. This agreement is effective upon the signature of the designated officials of each
- B. This agreement will be valid for five years from the date of signature.
- C. It is intended that exchanges be reciprocal, within a three-year period. Every effort will be made to maintain an exchange balance within a calendar year. Reciprocity shall be subject to periodic review by both universities. The absence of exchanges during any one calendar year is possible and does not nullify this
- D. Modifications may be made to the agreement, upon written acceptance by both
- E. Either institution may terminate this agreement with six months' written notice. Exchanges planned or in progress when termination is instituted will be

F. The agreement may be renewed by mutual consent of both parties, following an evaluation of all components of the program.

AGREEMENT for FACULTY/STAFF/SCHOLAR EXCHANGE PROGRAM between RAJASTHAN COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING FOR WOMEN and BEENA MAHAVIDYALAYA

PURPOSE

The Rajasthan College of Engineering for Women, Jaipur and Beena Mahavidyalaya hereby agree upon the following terms and conditions in connection with a reciprocal faculty/staff/scholar exchange program. Both RCEW and Beena Mahavidyalaya may be referred to individually as the "party" or collectively as the "parties".

ADMINISTRATION

Each party shall appoint an exchange coordinator to implement the terms of this exchange agreement. The coordinator will serve as the contact person on campus and will be responsible for arrangements associated with visits, including arranging for necessary approvals and acting as a resource person for the general welfare of the exchange faculty, staff and/or scholars. The coordinator of this exchange program at RCEW, Jaipur and Beena Mahavidhvalya Coordinators shall notify their counterparts should a new person be named to the position.

OBJECTIVE:-

Faculty/Scientist/Staff Exchanges

- (i) The exchange of faculty to the mutual benefit of both institutions.
- (ii) Collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of mutual interest.
- (iii) The exchange of academic materials and publications,
- (iv) Conducting lectures.
- (v) Undertaking joint research.
- (vi) Attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, attendance of courses, upgrading of teaching and research skills.
- (vii) Participating in seminars, symposiums, and other types of academic discussions.

(viii) Co-supervising post-graduate students.

(ix) Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work.

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RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTIES

- The parties shall, for a duration to be determined on a case-to-case basis and after written agreement, invite faculty, staff and/or scholars for teaching and/or research visits. Exchange faculty members must have a sufficient command of the language of instruction, if they are invited to teach.
- All travel and living expenses shall be borne by the home institution, unless otherwise stipulated by the written agreement of the parties. The host institution agrees to assist exchange faculty, staff and/or scholars in locating suitable lodging.
- 3. The parties shall inform the exchange faculty, staff and/or scholars regularly about the curricular programs offered by each, and especially about research seminars, colloquia, conferences and symposia organized by each. They shall exchange documentation and publications issued from these proceedings.
- 4. Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.
- 5. An exchange student will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution.
- An exchange student will be considered as full-time "exchange" student at the host institution.

VALIDITY AND TERMINATION

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of FIVE years commencing from effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review.

Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice of one months in advance to the other institution. Once terminated, neither RCEW Jaipur nor Beena Mahavidyalaya will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer.

RCEW, Jaipur and Beena Mahavidyalaya welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for cooperation for faculty and Student Exchange and jointly agree to the provisions as set out above.

CLAUSE 1

FOLLOWS:

CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish co-operation.
- 1.2 First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities.
- 1.3 The parties shall co-operate with each other and shall as promptly as is responsibly practical, relevant agreement.
- 1.4 The colleges to give space and necessary help to conduct offline training sessions in college premises
- 1.5 The virtual training medium will be Ananya's responsibility whereas the internet connectivity and digital access of students will be supported by the college

- 2.3 Placement of trained students: second party will help in the delivery of the training and placement of the students of the first party on the technology trends and in house requirements. This does not guarantee placement.
- 2.4 There is no financial commitment on the part of the RAJASTHAN COLLEGE OF BHOINGERING FOR WOMEN first party to take up any program mention in MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.
- 2.5 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required.

CLAUSE 3

VALIDITY

3.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period, the Second Part.

CLAUSE 4

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

4.1 It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall be a partnership for the limited purpose of ANANYA Facilitating Employability skilling to the students of the college, with its strategic corporate connects.


